PROTOCOL

on the Establishment of Diplomatic Relations between Malta and the Republic of Bosnia-Herzegovina.

In order to develop their relations on the basis of the principles of equality of states, mutual respect, self determination, independence and sovereignty, territorial integrity, non-interference in internal affairs and peaceful solution of international controversies on the principles of the United Nations Charter,

Malta and the Republic of Bosnia - Herzegovina agreed to establish diplomatic relations at ambassadorial level as from the date of this Protocol.

Both parties agreed to conduct their relations in the spirit of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations of 18 April 1961 as well as the Principles and Commitments of the OSCE.

The two Parties have also agreed that agreements previously signed between Malta and the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, unless subsequently revoked, shall remain applicable between Malta and the Republic of Bosnia - Herzegovina, until such time as these agreements are revised or replaced.

Signed in Valletta, on *14th* October 1995.
